Pastor's Peace

After eating refried beans at every meal for almost a week I knew what I wanted for dinner the first night I came back from El Salvador: BURGER! I had the monthly Church Council meeting later that night, so Emma and the kids came to meet me after work in Falls Church for *Elevation Burger*. Emma knew my stomach was a bit "messed up" from my trip and cautioned me to take it easy, but I already decided: the special with everything. We ordered our food and got settled at a table.

I stood up and walked over the drink machine. I pressed the icon for water and filled up four cups. As I stood there watching each cup fill with water, I had this realization that the water was clean, safe to drink, and abundant. This seems so obvious now, but after a week of carefully sanitizing my hands, brushing my teeth with bottled water and filling my waterbottle with "safe drinking water" I was overcome with a feeling of thankfulness for the accessibility of clean water.

I returned to the table, gave each person their cup of water, and then started to reflect on the comfort that comes with our context. I breathed in the smell of the food cooking, appreciated the safety of the restaurant environment, and the freedom to walk the streets outside. My reflection ended as the waiter arrived with our food and my focus centered around the love for family and being back with them safe and sound. We folded our hands and thanked God for our food. Amen.

Reflecting back on that experience, and now looking forward to the season of Advent, I am reminded of the

need for hope. While in El Salvador I heard many stories of people looking for hope from fellow Christians outside their country, and I also heard stories of people



looking for hope and attempting to seek opportunities elsewhere via a caravan. We are all people who are dependent upon hope.

This December, I ask you not only to take a moment and thank God for the little things we take for granted daily like clean water, safety and family, but also to be an agent of hope. More specifically, this year churches in the Metro DC Synod celebrate 25 years of the Gifts of Hope program. Gifts of Hope provides anyone the opportunity to offer a little bit of hope to the ministries and agencies that do so much good and hopeful work both locally and globally. In closing, I thank God for you. I thank God the story and life of Jesus has touched your heart and inspired you to be an agent of love and hope in the world. Thank you for being that little light wherever you are: home, work, neighborhood, etc. I look forward to celebrating this special time of their year with you and your family.

Corey's Corner by

How does one become a Vicar?



I've been able to tell this story in some places but not in others. I figure wanting to become a Pastor in this day and age isn't the most common of things, so for this newsletter issue, I've decided to tell the brief story of how I felt my

calling, and all the ways it's pulled me to and fro until I ended up among the wonderful people of Holy Trinity.

My call to ministry starts what feels like a long time ago. I was in 10th grade and had just been confirmed at my home church. I don't know if it was because I wasn't paying attention, or that I just didn't hold onto any of the knowledge passed onto me in my three years in confirmation, but I left the program with so many questions, and like I had missed a lot of the things I just said I believed in. So I joined a mentoring group where High School Youth who had just finished going through confirmation would be partnered with a group of young girls and boys who were just starting their journey. Side note—I attended a very large church growing up that had around 100 youth in confirmation at any given time is my guess. Anyway, I took this as an opportunity to go through confirmation again really, and even though I didn't get any more information from the program, I did learn a lot more about myself and faith in general during the 3 years that I participated in the TIM Team mentoring program. The people I ended up learning from were my fellow TIM Teamers and the youth Pastor who took the time to wrestle and question things with me as we all worked together.

It was because of my involvement in the TIM Team program that, as a high school senior, I was invited to lead an educational session during one of the retreats

the confirmation program went on every year. This one in particular was officially called the "Relationship Retreat", but for the students it was simply the "Sex Retreat". The name came out of the fact that this is the time when the Church talked to its 9th graders about relationships; not only with God but with each other, and sometimes more specifically with people they are attracted to. The session I led was on being in a relationship with your enemy. I took clips from Harry Potter and Draco Malfoy's relationship and related them to Jesus' call to pray for our enemy and turn the other cheek. Nothing all that remarkable happened during my sessions; outside of kids having honest discussion about what this all meant, and how it related to their lives. But as I was leaving the camp to go home on Sunday morning I felt something. I would like to think it was the presence of the spirit, but all I know is that for some reason I didn't want that to be the last time I was in front of people talking about faith; in fact, I was suddenly consumed by the idea that I should be doing this for the rest of my life as my vocation.

Now my idea of what ministry is and what my ministry will look like has changed over the years, but I've never lost that connection to the young man sitting in his car on the way home from camp wanting to work in God's Church. During college, I kept coming back to my home church to work as an intern with youth and lead VBS programs, even though it wouldn't really help me with a career in my poli-sci major. And every year, that summer job would feed my spirit and keep me wanting more; therefore, in my Senior year of college I started applying to Seminaries—and the rest I'll leave for next quarters' newsletter, so stay tuned.

Getting Connected

During our 70th anniversary year, we are featuring Holy Trinity's history by decades.

GROWING AND SERVING: 1960-1980.

In January of 1963, Pastor Yost accepted a call to another mission, and in April of 1963, Reverend William L. Nies was installed as pastor of Holy Trinity. The new (and current) sanctuary was dedicated on February 21, 1965. The large chancel window over the altar, depicting the Holy Trinity, a gift from an anonymous donor, was dedicated in 1965. The clerestory windows, depicting the apostles, were dedicated in 1966. A new pipe organ was dedicated in 1966; funding was available for only one third of the pipes, but ranks of pipes were gradually added until the organ was completed in May, 1982. The hand bell program began in 1975. Holy Trinity's membership grew in the early 60's; in 1964 there were 640 members and four choirs. To help with the growing membership, a Vicar program was initiated in 1967. By 1970 the need for additional staff could not be filled by interns, and Douglas Langholz was installed as Assistant Pastor in September of 1970.

In 1969, the Falls Church Community Services Council was started, to help low-income families. It began as a vision of Orville Splitt, a layman at Holy Trinity, and Pastor Nies, who were aware of the needs of the poor and disadvantaged in the Falls Church area. They

believed that churches working together could provide services that otherwise would not be available. In June of 1969 eleven churches responded to that call, and the Falls Church Community Service Council was born. The original program offered emergency transportation, food and housing assistance. This organization continues today to help area residents.

In February 1970 the church experienced a break-in and vandalism resulting in thousands of dollars' worth of damage. Over 54 Holy Trinity members (including current member Genie Davis) donated over 145 hours of their time to help with the clean-up and repair.

In 1971 Holy Trinity held one of its largest Vacation Bible School sessions, with over 400 children attending. In 1972 Holy Trinity sponsored a missionary to New Guinea and in 1973 began sponsorship of Reverend Richard Wangen as missionary in Brazil.

To mark its 25th anniversary, in May of 1974, Holy Trinity held an opening service at Jefferson Theater and a parade from the theater to the church. Sunday School students and other church members carried signs and banners as they marched. In September of that year, as part of the 25th anniversary celebration, a group of 25 Holy Trinity members visited Germany and Switzerland on a Reformation Heritage Tour. In November of 1974 Pastor Nies accepted a call to another church and Pastor Langholz became our Senior Pastor.


Getting Connected


