**every child at Graham Road Elementary School.** Please use your weekly envelopes for cash—for checks, please designate Graham Road (GRES) Books on the memo line.

Graham Road Elementary School (GRES), the closest elementary school to the church, is a Title-1 school serving students from many low-income homes. The most recent statistics for their student body report 87% Hispanic students, with 58% classified as English learners and 86% receiving free or reduced price meals.

Once again we are partnering with Reading Is Fundamental (RIF) to obtain the books. The GRES reading specialist, with recommendations from the teachers, will select books from RIF's online catalog suitable for students in Head Start through 6th grade and at all reading levels.

## Pastor's Peace

#### Lifting Up, Reaching Out!

When you think of our mini-mission statement – Lifting Up, Reaching Out – what comes to mind for you?



Take a moment and make a list. Put yourself in the picture. What does Lifting Up, Reaching Out mean to you?

What comes to mind for me is us singing in the sanctuary. Why? It's the words to the hymn We Are an Offering.

We lift our voices We lift our hands We lift our lives up to You We are an offering

We do lift up our voices in song every Sunday, both individually and collectively. Now we may not lift our hand while singing in worship, we do lift our hands when we ask for God's blessing on individuals or families when they join the church, when we send them off, when we confirm youth and when we ask for healing. We also ask the ushers and acolytes to lift up the offerings we bring to God.

The lifting of our lives, that may be a bit different. I think that might be the transition in our mini-mission statement and in the hymn. The second part of our mini-mission statement to reach out is how we move out into the world from our congregational setting. We use the Word and Sacraments of worship to be sent back into the world and reach out to our neighbors. Here is the second verse:

Lord use our voices
Lord use our hands
Lord use our lives they are Yours
We are an offering

God works through us in the world to bring hope, love, peace and justice. Our voices, hands and lives are powerful agents of change in the world. We can only do so much as individuals, so God brings us into community so that we can offer a greater impact, but also a greater presence. Here is the third and final verse:

All that we have
All that we are
All that we hope to be
We give to You
We give to You

We sing these verses, but do we really realize what we are saying? All that we <u>have</u>, <u>are</u> and <u>hope to be</u> we give to God?! That is an amazing commitment. How fortunate are we to have fellow members of the church that can lift us up and reach out to us in our time of need. And then, that same love is passed on in our voices, hands and lives when others are in need of our help.

We are a faith community. A faith community that believes the God of grace lifts up and reaches out to us. So it is then our opportunity to think again how we felt when called as a community to lift up and reach out to our neighborhood – both locally and globally. What do you think God is calling us to do?

#### Why Join a Women's Bible Study?



Each time I gather with women, I feel the presence of women who've gathered together for centuries, across the world. Long ago, on a morning not yet known as Easter, it is the women, together with the Beloved Disciple, who remained with Jesus at the cross. Their

hopes had been destroyed. Their fears were realized. Their tears were flowing. Yet they showed up. They witnessed the worst kind of death imaginable. Yet they didn't abandon Jesus, and they didn't abandon each other. I like to image them together; clasping hands, crying, holding one another up. Each body is strengthened by the others. Each one's grief is offered for the other, for Jesus and for the world.

Women get it. They know the healing power of soup after a loved one dies. They know ice cream, cookies and lots of chocolate can help heal a broken heart. They know the magic of coffee for the bleary-eyed mom of a newborn. They know the perfect book to recommend, which laugh-out-loud meme to share, and the random text to send to remind a friend she or he is not alone.

Women know playdates are best in the company of friends. They know wrangling kids at church takes a village – friends, fellow mamas, aunts and grandmas. They know the goodness of quilts, care packages and homemade cookies. They know the beauty of Bible study groups where you show up tired, frustrated and overwhelmed, but are met with words of welcome and love: "We're glad you're here."

When we gather as women, we gather in strength and vulnerability to share our deepest joys and hurts and listen to those same stories from others. We embrace the vulnerability of naming our fears and deepest desires, and the strength of overcoming them, together. Women get it. That's why I continually find myself with the women. I need their faith. I need their presence. I need their tears and their laughter. Most importantly, I need

them to show me Christ. I need to look them in the eyes and see the body of Christ – the blessed, holy, broken, beautiful body where all are valued and needed. All have something to share. We gather as women who believe in the power of resurrection – the power to transform lives from small bits of bread, wine, coffee, tea, needle and fabric.

I keep finding myself with the women. And in them, I find myself in Christ.


