

Pastor's Peace

The Smell of "Church"

A fellow member, upon walking into the sanctuary the other day, mentioned the space smelled like "church." I was caught a bit off guard by the comment. I never thought of church having a particular smell other than maybe coffee wafting from the lobby. Maybe the member was referring to the smell of the sanctuary space that is specific to Holy Trinity. But then it started to take on more meaning. Maybe the smell of "church" is imbedded into the rugs, pews and walls. And if that were the case, maybe it is then also the smell of worship, the smell of generations gathered, of friendship and/or the smell of divinity in our midst. Oooh, how about the presence of God's kingdom on earth?!

We humans have found lots of ways to capture the essence of space with other senses in the form of pictures, trinkets, recipes or videos, but it is really hard to capture a smell. Evidently, our church space has a completely unique and special "church" smell that can only be captured here — most often on Sunday.

The obvious next question is, what feelings does the smell of "church" invoke? I hope you have a great answer, but in case you are still searching, I want to offer you one. I hope the smell of "church" invokes a feeling of joy.

Why joy? The feeling of joy is mentioned in the scriptures to describe what it is like when the heavenly realm meets the earthly realm.

For example, when the three kings arrive and see the child:

¹⁰ When they saw that the star had stopped,^[b] they were overwhelmed with <u>iov</u>. ¹¹ On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. (Matthew 2:10-11)

And when Jesus describes the feeling one encounters when the kingdom is found:

"The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field, which someone found and hid; then in his **joy** he goes and sells all that he has and buys that field." (Matthew 13:44)

And when women encounter the resurrection and the empty tomb:

⁷Then go quickly and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead, ^[a] and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him.' This is my message for you. ⁸So they left the tomb quickly with fear and great <u>iov</u>, and ran to tell his disciples. ⁹Suddenly Jesus met them and said, "Greetings!" And they came to him, took hold of his feet, and worshiped him. (Matthew 28:7-9)

This Sunday, when you arrive to worship and are present with your fellow members of our church family, take a deep breath and inhale what may be the pure joy. You won't be able to find it anywhere else.

Council News

Ah, fall! Just the thought of cooler temperatures and the autumn beauty of God's creation is enough to make me smile—and I hope it does the same for you.

Your church council has been busy since July addressing a number of needs, including: electing Council officers; conducting a final evaluation of the single-service schedule; replacing the services provided by long-time HT accountant Laura Rose; ensuring a proper fiscal year transition, and revising the church's Chart of Accounts; developing a position description for a Director of Children/Youth/Family Ministry and overseeing recruitment efforts for the position; developing plans for a fall stewardship program and reconstituted stewardship team; developing recommendations for an overdue update of the HT Constitution, and determining how 70th Anniversary Campaign funds will be disbursed.

Looking ahead through the end of the year, I expect council efforts will include overseeing further administrative improvements, including a likely change in our payroll processing vendor and potentially other contractors to reduce expenses; considering how best to strengthen Children/Youth/Family ministry given the challenges in filling the Director position; developing 2020 council goals, and ensuring planning gets under way for the "congregational renewal" activities being made possible by the Lilly Endowment grant linked to Pastor Mike's Summer 2020 sabbatical. Never a shortage of matters for council's consideration and action!

Having been given the opportunity to serve as the congregation and council president for 2019-20, I want to close by thanking Pastor Mike and Mary Minette for their guidance on matters great and small as I have been "learning the ropes" over the summer and by thanking those who agreed to serve as officers and members of the 2019-20 council: Scott Sherard, Vice-President; Joe Kile, Treasurer; Mary Minette, Secretary; and members Seth Clark, Karen Cockerham, Julie Davis, Charles Luoma-Overstreet, Lynn McKay, Beth Search, Brent Stone, and Rob Young.








Member Interview

as told to Genie Davis



On Saturday, August 25, Holy Trinity said goodbye and Godspeed to longtime member Jean Ball as she relocates from her home in Falls Church to live with her daughter Cynthia in Tennessee.

Jean first attended Holy Trinity in the summer of 1950, when services were held in the Jefferson Theater (now a Goodwill Store on Annandale Road at Arlington Boulevard) and has been a member for 68 years. She and her immediate family—James and Caroline Meighan and sister Lois—had been residents of Northeast District of Columbia until their move to Falls Church in 1949 when Westlawn neighborhood homes were brand new. They had been members of Atonement Lutheran Church in northwest D. C., where Jean was confirmed, but they happily cut down their Sunday commute by RSVP'ing to an invitation from Pastor Edward Yost to join the very young Holy Trinity Lutheran Church. Jean remembers being one of only two members of her Sunday School class: they sometimes spent class time helping to count the day's offering.

Jean was born and spent her early years in Wilkes-Barre, Pennsylvania. The Meighan family moved to the District when her father James became part of the crew building Washington National Airport in the swampland abutting the Potomac River. Jean attended elementary school in the District but graduated from Falls Church High School. For 7 or 8 weeks in 1951 and after graduation, she interned at the Pentagon. Jean remembers that her Pentagon supervisor subsequently came to her home to invite her to return—one of two times she was asked to return by a former boss.

As a young adult living in Northern Virginia, Jean enjoyed roller skating at the rink in Alexandria. It was there she met her future husband Donald Ball, a serviceman stationed at the Pentagon. Their marriage on February 14, 1953 (Holy Trinity's first) was performed by Pastor Yost in the old sanctuary (now known as Rothenberg Hall). The whole congregation was invited to the wedding and reception (catering by the Falls Church Bakery). Their three children—Janice, David, and Cynthia—were baptized, confirmed and married at Holy Trinity. One grandchild also was baptized here. When her children had grown some, Jean returned to the labor market and worked outside the home for 44 years until she retired in December 1999. Her first job at a Marriott establishment lasted from March 1960 until September 1973 when she accepted a position with Giant Stores where she stayed for 23 years.

Jean remembers learning to drive only after the birth of her first child. That was the time when gas station attendants filled your empty tank and washed your windshield, a practice Jean endorsed and continued for the rest of her driving career—that is, except for a day in January 1983 when she pumped her own gas for the first and only time in her life. She will not need to drive in Tennessee so that record stands.

In all, 12 members of Jean's extended family were HT members. When the new sanctuary was completed (the one in use today), it was not uncommon for the family to fill the entire front pew. Memorial services have been held here for her husband Don, mother and father, sister, brother in law, and uncle. Over the years, the family worked actively with the Property Committee and participated in Couples Club and Women of the Church activities. In recent years, Jean has been a member of the Altar Guild to which she was recruited by Marie Rothenberg. She also worked in the Church Office to assist Parish Administer Joan Buscher with the Sunday bulletins and other projects.

Jean will dearly miss her HT family, friends and the OWL ladies when she moves to her new home. FYI—Jean's phone number in Tennessee will be the one she had in Falls Church.

REMINDER: Our fall Congregational Celebration and Meeting is on Sunday, November 17, in Fellowship Hall. In early October, letters were sent to congregation members from Council President which included the meeting agenda and information regarding proposed amendments to the HT Constitution. will be able to fill in.


